

University History






The University of Science and Technology succeeded the Kumasi College of Technology which was established by a Government Ordinance on 6th October, 1951. It was however, opened officially on 22nd January, 1952, with 200 Teacher Training students transferred from Achimota, to form the nucleus of the new College.



October, 1952 School of Engineering and the Department of Commerce established






January, 1953 Pharmacy Department established


The Pharmacy Department was established in January, 1953, with the transfer of the former School of Pharmacy from Korle-Bu Hospital, Accra, to the College. The Department ran a two-year comprehensive course in Pharmacy leading to the award of the Pharmacy Board Certificate.



1953 Department of Agriculture opened

The Department of Agriculture was opened in the same year to provide a number of ad hoc courses of varying duration, from a few terms to three years, for the Ministry of Agriculture. A Department of General Studies was also instituted to prepare students for the Higher School Certificate Examinations in both Science and Arts subjects and to give instruction in such subjects as were requested by the other departments.





University History Con't



1957 inauguration of School of Architecture, Town Planning and Building

The Kumasi College of Technology expanded in 1957 with the inauguration of the School of Architecture, Town Planning, and Building, admitting its first students in 1958. To focus on science and technology, the Teacher Training College (except the Art School) was moved to Winneba in 1958, and the Commerce Department was relocated to Achimota in 1959, forming the foundation of the University of Ghana's School of Administration.



Accession to University Status - The birth of KNUST

In December, 1960, the Government of Ghana appointed a University Commission to advise it on the future development of University Education in Ghana, in connection with the proposal to transform the University College of Ghana and the Kumasi College of Technology into an independent University of Ghana.

Following the report of the commission which came out early 1961, Government decided to establish two independent Universities in Kumasi and at Legon near Accra.



22nd August, 1961 Accession to University Status - The birth of KNUST

The Kumasi College of Technology was thus transformed into a full-fledged University and renamed Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology by an Act of Parliament on 22nd August, 1961.



1966 Change of University name to University of Science and Technology

The University's name was changed to University of Science and Technology after the Revolution of 24th February, 1966. The University of Science and Technology was officially inaugurated on Wednesday, 20th November, 1961. However, by another act of Parliament, Act 559 of 1998, the University has been renamed Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, Kumasi.

The Emblem



The Emblem of the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology is made up of the aesthetic arrangement of six distinct elements. These elements are relevant to the prime objectives of the University - Teaching, Research and Service to humanity. They are: a Pot of Fire, Callipers, a Golden Stool, an Eagle with outstretched wings, Green leaves, and a Slogan.

The Arrangement

The traditional Ghanaian pot of fire, is placed at the top of the emblem with a pair of open callipers turned upside down and hooked to the sides of the stool on which is perched an eagle with outstretched wings. There are two green leaves, one under each wing of the eagle. There is a motif carved in the middle section of the stool called "Nyansapo" ("The Knot of Wisdom")

Beneath all these is a slogan "Nyansapo Wosane No Badwenma" ("The knot of wisdom is untied only by the wise.) The slogan is embossed on a banner folded artistically in three parts around the base of the stool.



The Pot of Fire:

The pot signifies the storehouse of knowledge. The flame represents the quest for knowledge which should be kept alive and burning always.



The Calipers:

This tool, which is used by a cross-section of scientists and technologists, represents science and technology as the foundation or the cornerstone of the development and progress of the country.



The Stool:

The stool symbolizes traditional authority and the maxim "Knowledge is Power." Comprising three parts (seat, middle motif, and base), it represents the University as the pinnacle of education and authority in science and technology in Ghana.

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The Emblem Con't



The colour of the stool, gold, signifies the plethora of natural mineral resources of the nation. It also depicts the Golden Stool, the symbol of authority of the Ashanti nation, in whose capital the University is sited. The motif in the middle portion of the stool is called "Nyansapo" ("The Knot of Wisdom"). This underscores the University's status as the repository of knowledge and wisdom for untying intricate knots or problems.



The Eagle:

The eagle symbolizes leadership, vision, and problem-solving, reflecting the University's ability to address national challenges effectively. Its neck-band, adorned with Ghana's national colors and a black star, represents the University's national character.



Green Leaves:

These leaves stand for the land and its rich natural resources. The tree that produces these leaves is called "Adwunu." Leaves from the Adwunu tree are used for purification. The green leaves, therefore, also signify the purification of the minds of those who pass through this University.



The Slogan:

The Slogan - "Nyansapo wosane no badwenma" ("The knot of Wisdom is untied only by the wise") indicates the goal of the University, which is to produce the highly skilled manpower required for the technological advancement of Ghana and Africa.

Knowing The SRC

The KNUST Student Representative Council colloquially known as "KNUST SRC" is the legitimate representative student government of the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, Kumasi. The council was established in 1957. The Council is responsible for the administration of student services, campus-wide events, and student advocacy at KNUST.

There are about **40** students at any given time serving on the Council: a President, Vice President, General Secretary, Financial Secretary, Women's Commissioner, and other appointees. Students from the six colleges and foreigners also have a representative on the Council.

The SRC collaborates with the local chapter of the Graduate Students Association of Ghana (GRASAG) and the National Students Union of Ghana Students (NUGS). Miss Yvonne Osei Adobea, the first female President of KNUST SRC is the outgoing, with Master Francis Nana Kane as the current President.

The KNUST SRC even though listed as one of the University governing council's representatives per the act that established the KNUST in 1952 had no representation on the council until 1957 when Dr. Joe Okyere Condua who served for two consecutive years was appointed as the SRC president, but was not recognized on the university's governing council.

KNUST Student Representative Council is responsible for advocacy on behalf of students and funding student activities on campus. The Council operates with a budget that is primarily dispensed to student organizations, but it also funds social events and student initiatives.

As the sole representative student government, the KNUST SRC provides services like most student unions and also advocacy on behalf of the students.

5. COURSE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE
